MANAGEMENT AND UK PRODUCTIVITY

- UK productivity is 16% below G7 competitors
- Poor management costs UK economy £84bn per year
- Brexit creating uncertainty 57% of managers report this as a concern





WHAT EMPLOYERS WANT

- 70% say all students should have access to management and leadership modules to improve employability
- 66% say they want degrees to come with professional accreditation

DRIVING STUDENT RECRUITMENT

- 37k learners on CMI degree accredited courses
- 4 out of 5 HE partners say that partnership has impacted student recruitment
- Nearly 3 out of 5 first years were aware of CMI accreditation at application
 - 84% of these said CMI accreditation influenced their decision





BUILDING A DIVERSE RANGE OF FUTURE LEADERS



- 56% / 44% male:female ratio
- 35% of students were from BAME backgrounds

 32% of students from the bottom two POLAR quintiles



A STUDENT-CENTRIC LEARNING EXPERIENCE

- NSS satisfaction with CMI accredited courses is 83%
- 69% said CMI resources gave them confidence to tackle academic and employment challenges







% agreeing that they are obtaining management competencies as part of their CMI accreditation




EMPLOYMENT OUTCOMES




