John's work at Inmarsat - a leader in global mobile satellite communications - is focused on protecting the lives of people working on board ships around the world.

LEADING GLOBAL TRANSFORMATION

In the early stages of the Senior Leader Apprenticeship, John realised that programme would provide him with the necessary Management and Leadership skills to advance an ambitious project on next-generation maritime safety satellite services with a multidisciplinary team.

As a former sergeant in the Forces, I had some understanding of managing people and projects. But, the Apprenticeship has accelerated my capabilities far beyond this.

It has enabled me to adopt a more effective approach to leading my team, enhancing my collaboration with colleagues to implement changes that save lives on a daily basis.

John also found that having a more solid grounding in Management and Leadership has opened up new directions for business.

I have been able to lead interactions with new sectors, and these relationships have catapulted our project to a global scale.

Where this matters most is for the 1.6 million seafarers on 120,000 vessels sailing the oceans, often in remote areas and unimaginably treacherous conditions.

These innovations mean that ships in distress now have almost instantaneous access to their nearest rescue centres, offering the best possible chance of survival. This will save countless lives for many years to come.

As John progressed through his SLA training, his friends, family and colleagues noticed a marked difference in John's confidence and sense of purpose.

John highlights that these changes emerged from his direct action in the Apprenticeship.
