With a long-established academic and teaching profile in sustainability leadership and management, Karen is committed to supporting career journeys that contribute to environmental and social organisational and broader, global goals.

Her research and teaching interests focus on the intersection of sustainability, employability and related skills development. Her practice deeply aligns with the United Nations 'Principles of

Responsible Management Education' (PRME). She is Secretary for PRME UK and Ireland Chapter Steering Committee, and a committee member of the Working Group on 'Climate Change and the Environment', which includes leading a mentoring programme and facilitating climate literacy sessions. On behalf of PRME UK and Ireland, she co-leads a group on 'Careers and Sustainability'.
